

Mac OS X - El Capitan - New Features

Apple Mail

- Minimize e-mails while in full-screen mode
 - Drag and drop photos from one e-mail to the other
 - New messages are “tab-able”
 - New multi-touch gestures (swipe left for trash or right to keep as new)
 - Calendar integration so you can easily add appointments to your calendar

Photos

- Share option now includes recent contacts
 - New category for screenshots (great for cleaning up your phone!)
 - Support for 3rd party extensions

Spotlight

- Allows you to search like how you speak (i.e. “emails from David”, “documents I wrote last week”)
 - Weather forecast
 - Sports Scores
-

Split Screen Mode

- Can be activated by either holding the green button at the top left of most apps (then drag to left or right) or by entering Mission Control
- Resize by dragging black vertical bar
- Opinion - Works really well with Mail & Calendar

Safari

- Pinned sites (drag tab to the left). When you close the window and then open a new window, pinned sites will still be there.
- Share button now supports reminders and notes
- Mute button for individual windows or all windows

Notes

- Now you can create folders of notes
- Drawing capability
- Create check lists
- Show all attachments by type

Calendar

- Shows events found in Mail
- Talks to Apple Maps so it now tells you when you need to leave in order to compensate for traffic.

Other

- Newly designed Disk Utility
- Airplay videos without having to be in full screen (Safari Only)
- New wallpapers (only two)
- System Preferences - General - Hide Menu & Dock Option (not recommended)
- System Preferences - App Store - Change password preferences
- Notes, Mail, and Messages now detects flight numbers. Click the box around it to track the flight

Settings

- Settings is now searchable. Just swipe down from the top of the Settings Menu.
- Cellular
 - Scroll to Bottom to reveal “Wi-Fi Assist”
- Notifications
 - Group By App (not recommended)
- General
 - Siri
 - Train “Hey Siri”
- Wallpaper
- Battery
 - Low Power Mode
- Wallet & Apple Pay
 - Ability to Disable Double-Click Home Button

Maps

Includes transit directions in some cities

Calendars

Talks to Maps, gives guidance as to when you need to leave to get to your destination on time.

Photos

New drag to select multiple photos feature.

Back to App

New feature to navigate to the App you were just in when a notification pops up.

Notification Center

(swipe down from top of screen)

Now ordered chronologically

“Today” now includes battery percentage of iPhone & Apple Watch

Siri Suggestions

Swipe from left to right on the home screen. This includes suggested contacts, apps, and nearby locations of things like restaurants, gas stations, shopping, etc. Info is based on your history, time, and location. Also includes recent news stories

Siri

New graphical interface that resembles the Apple Watch. No more “ding” noise (only vibration).

Apple Mail

Select All feature (only works with some e-mail services). Accessible via “select”

iCloud Drive

iCloud Drive is now its own App (complete with folder structure)

News

A new app that resembles Flipboard.

Notes

New look. Includes check lists and drawing

Passbook is now Wallet

Double click home button from lock screen to go immediately into Apple Pay.
