How to find your parked car with Maps

With iOS 10, *Maps* marks the location of your car with a pin when your walk away and your iPhone disengages from the Bluetooth link in your car—so you can easily find where you parked.

You need an iPhone 6 or later and iOS 10 to use this *Maps* feature. Also, one time only, verify the following *Settings* for this to work:

• Turn on Location Services. Settings \rightarrow Privacy \rightarrow Location Services \rightarrow On.

• Make sure that Frequent Locations is on. Go to Settings \rightarrow Privacy \rightarrow Location Services \rightarrow System Services \rightarrow Frequent Locations \rightarrow Frequent Locations \rightarrow On.

• Turn on Show Parked Location. Go to Settings \rightarrow Maps \rightarrow Show Parked Location to the On.

• Make sure that your iPhone is paired to CarPlay or Bluetooth in your car. Settings \rightarrow Bluetooth \rightarrow On, then add your car (check your car's user's manual on how to do this).

When you leave your vehicle, your iPhone disconnects from Bluetooth, which causes *Maps* to mark the location of your car.

Find your car

When you're ready to go back to your car, follow these steps:

- 1. Open *Maps*.
- 2. Tap the *Search* field, then choose *Parked Car* from the suggestions list.
- 3. Tap Directions and choose *Drive*, *Walk*, or *Transit*.
- 4. Select the route that you prefer. When you are ready, tap *Go*.

Or save time and screen taps - just ask "Siri, where is my car parked"!

To remove a Parked Car pin, tap on the map. Then swipe up on the menu card, and tap *Remove Car*. Maps won't mark your parked car if you frequently park in the same location, like at home or work.
