Stream your photos.

Show off your photos, videos, and more on your HDTV.

You have friends over and you want to share great photos or the perfect party mix that's on your iPhone. Or you're in the middle of an epic action movie on your iPad that could use a little more screen. That's where AirPlay comes in. Just connect your device and Apple TV to the same Wi-Fi network, and the AirPlay icon automatically appears. Then tap the AirPlay icon in a specific app — Photos, Videos, Music, Safari, or any AirPlay-enabled app — and everything streams to your HDTV via your Apple TV.¹ It's a simple way to play your stuff on the biggest screen and the best sound system in the house.

Mirroring. Put your audience in the palm of your hand.



What you see is what you show.

AirPlay Mirroring lets you show exactly what's on your Mac, iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch screen to everyone in the room.² Show web pages, games, photos, videos, spreadsheets, class material, and more on your HDTV via Apple TV. Zoom in and out and pause for applause. Rotate from portrait to landscape and your audience sees that, too. AirPlay does it all wirelessly, so you can work the room or sit comfortably among the crowd. If you see it, so can they.

FaceTime

With a tap, you can make video calls over Wi-Fi from your iOS device to someone else's. You can even make FaceTime calls over cellular networks on your iPhone or iPad. And be there in person, even when you're not.⁴

Messages

Messages includes iMessage, a messaging service that's even better than texting because it's free over Wi-Fi for you and anyone using an iOS device or Mac. And it's unlimited.⁵ So text all you want, and send photos, videos, locations, and contacts, too. Or ask Siri to do it for you.

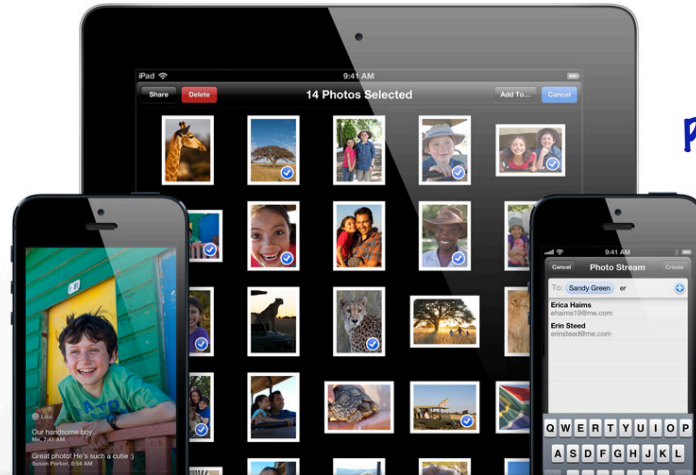


Shared Photo Streams.

Share select photos with a select audience.

Now you can share just the photos you want, with just the people you choose. Simply select photos from the Photos app, tap the Share button, choose who you want to share your photos with, and they're on their way. Friends using iCloud on an iOS 6 device or a Mac running Mountain Lion get the photos delivered immediately in the Photos app or iPhoto. You can even view Shared Photo Streams on Apple TV. If the folks you're sharing with aren't using an Apple device, they can view your photos on the web. People can like individual photos and make comments. And you can share as much as you want: Your Shared Photo Streams don't count against your iCloud storage, and they work over Wi-Fi and cellular networks.

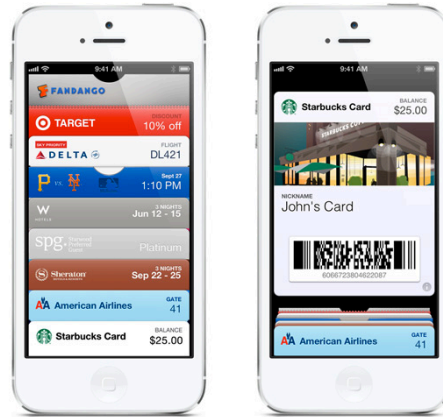

Passbook. Just the ticket. And the boarding pass, card, and coupon.

Your boarding passes, movie tickets, retail coupons, loyalty cards, and more are now all in one place. You can add passes to Passbook through apps, emails, and websites from participating airlines, theaters, stores, and more. Then you can scan your iPhone or iPod touch to check in for a flight, get into a movie, and redeem a coupon. You can also see when your coupons expire, where your concert seats are, and the balance left on that all-important coffee bar card. Wake your iPhone or iPod touch, and passes appear on your Lock screen at the appropriate time and place — like when you reach the airport or walk into the store to redeem your gift card or coupon. And if your gate changes after you've checked in for your flight, Passbook will even alert you to make sure you're not relaxing in the wrong terminal.

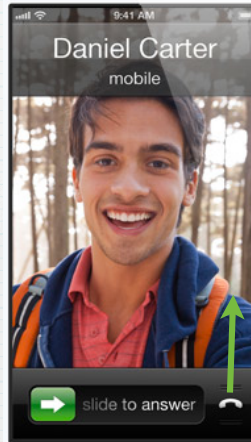

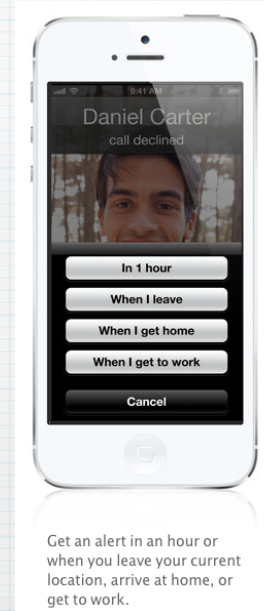
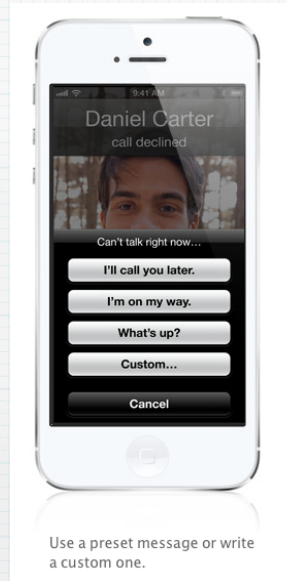

Redesigned with a more streamlined interface for easier reading and writing, Mail in iOS 6 lets you set up a VIP list so you'll never miss an important message from your accountant, your boss, or your BFF. It's even easier to add photos and videos to email messages. And to refresh your mailboxes, all you have to do is swipe down.

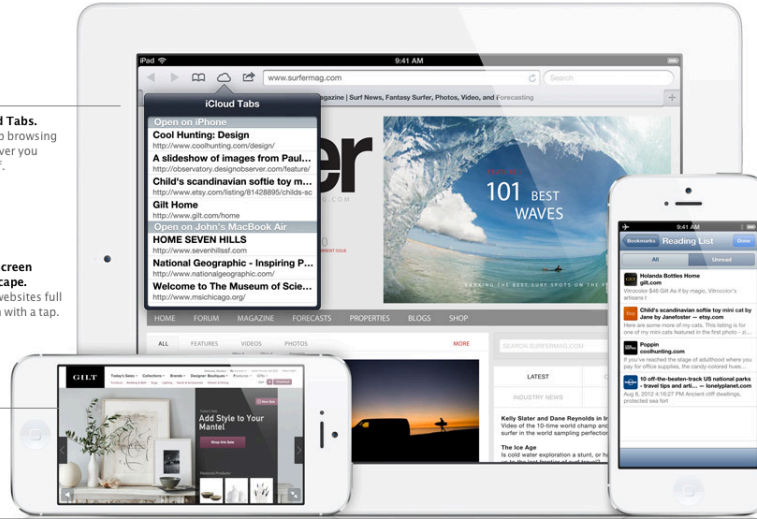
Safari. Browsing is just the beginning.

iOS 6 brings even better web browsing to your iPhone, iPad, and iPod touch. iCloud Tabs keeps track of which pages you have open on your devices, so you can start browsing on one device and pick up right where you left off, on whatever device is handy. Safari now saves web pages — not just links — in your Reading List, so you can catch up on your reading even when you can't connect to the Internet.⁴ And when you're posting a photo or video to eBay, Craigslist, or another site, you can take photos and video — or choose from your Camera Roll — without leaving Safari. When you really want to see the whole picture, turn your iPhone or iPod touch to landscape and tap the full-screen icon to view web pages without distractions.

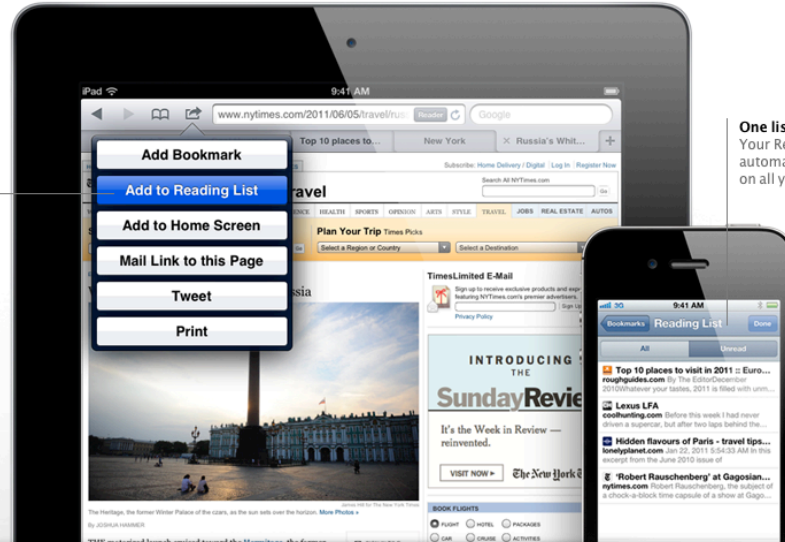

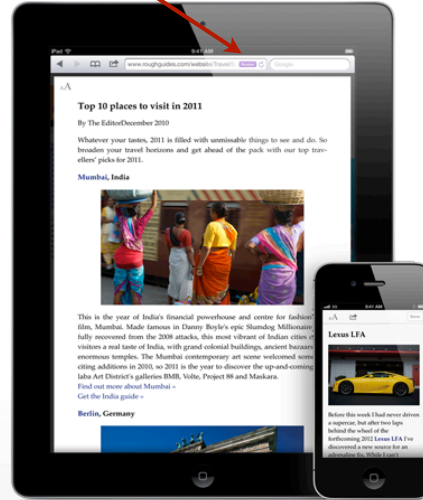

Reminders

A better way to do to-dos.

Next time you think to yourself, "Don't forget to..." just pull out your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch and jot it down. Reminders lets you organize your life in to-do lists — complete with due dates and locations. Say you need to remember to pick up milk during your next grocery trip. Since Reminders can be location based, you'll get an alert as soon as you pull into the supermarket parking lot. Reminders also works with iCal, Outlook, and iCloud, so changes you make update automatically on all your devices and calendars.

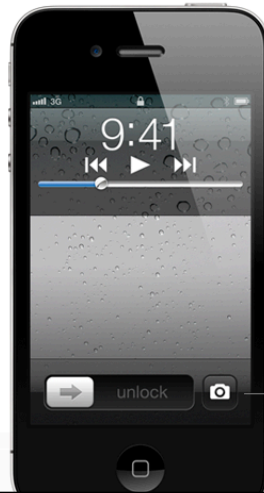
Camera

Capture the moment at a moment's notice.

Since your iPhone is always with you, it's often the best way to capture those unexpected moments. That's why you'll love the new camera features in iOS. You can open the Camera app right from the Lock screen. Use grid lines, pinch-to-zoom gestures, and single-tap focus and exposure locks to compose a picture on the fly. Then press the volume-up button to snap your photo in the nick of time. If you have Photo Stream enabled in [iCloud](#), your photos automatically download to all your other devices.

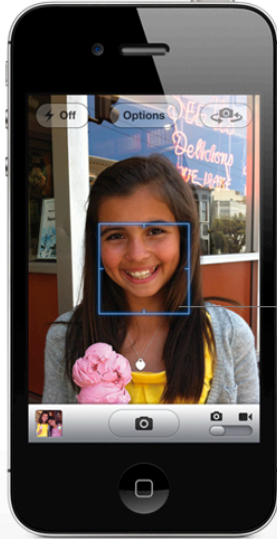

The new panorama feature for iPhone and iPod touch lets you capture everything from a momentous family reunion photo to a sweeping vista.⁶ With one simple motion you can shoot up to 240 degrees — even vertically, to get that redwood tree, say. Then hardware and software work together to create one seamless, high-resolution panorama.

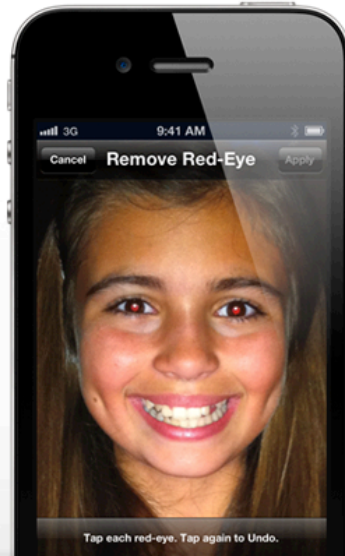

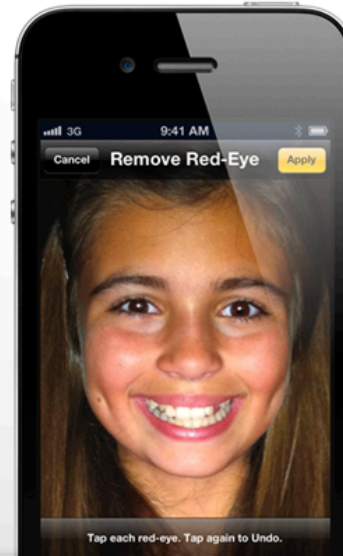

Calendar

Get more perspective on your schedule with year view on iPad and week view on iPhone and iPod touch. Tap to create an event and drag to adjust the time and duration. Add, rename, and delete calendars directly from your device. And view event attachments without leaving the Calendar app. [iCloud](#) lets you share calendars with friends and family, and it keeps your events in sync on all your devices.



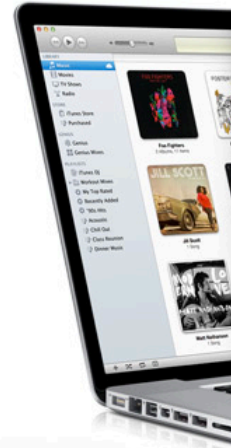

Wi-Fi Sync

Wirelessly sync your iOS device to your Mac or PC over a shared Wi-Fi connection. Every time you connect your iOS device to a power source (say, overnight for charging), it automatically syncs and backs up any new content to iTunes. So you always have your movies, TV shows, home videos, and photo albums everywhere you want them.

Safe and secure by design.

iOS is highly secure from the moment you turn on your iPhone. All apps run in a safe environment, so a website or app can't access data from other apps. iOS also supports encrypted network communication to protect your sensitive information. To guard your privacy, apps requesting location information are required to get your permission first. You can set a passcode lock to prevent unauthorized access to your device and configure iPhone to delete all your data after too many unsuccessful passcode attempts. And in case your iPhone is lost or stolen, Find My iPhone allows you to locate it on a map and remotely delete all your data. When you get it back, you can restore everything from your last backup.²

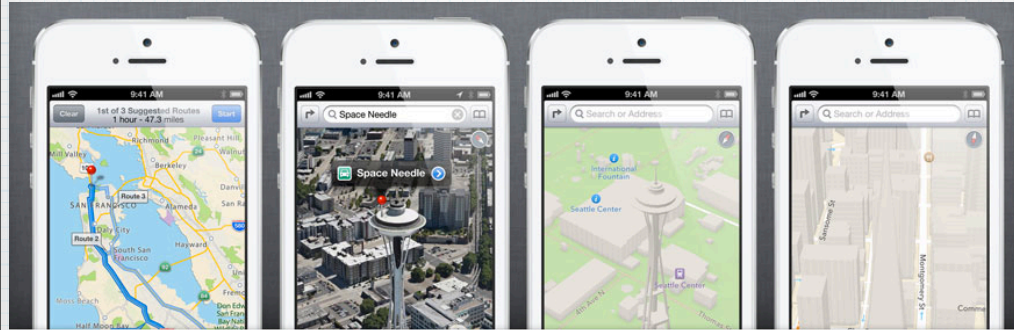

Get there with Quick Route.

When Maps drops a pin on a location, you can get turn-by-turn directions to that location almost instantly. Just tap the Quick Route button next to the location's name.

See up close with Flyover.

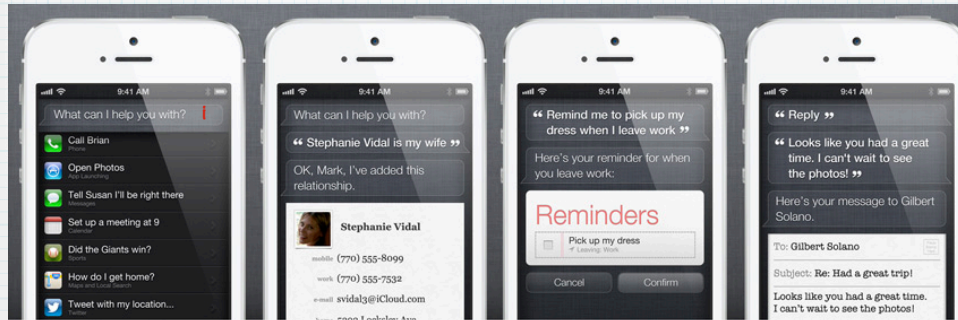
Switch to Flyover view in Maps by tapping the 3D button. Now you can explore cities from the air as you zoom, pan, and rotate around landmarks.

Tilt and rotate with two fingers.

As you're looking at a map, use two fingers to tilt or rotate the view. Maps keeps the names of the streets and places where they belong. So everything's easy to read, and you won't get lost.

Head north in a tap.

Rotate a map a few times, and you could lose your north-south orientation. But it's easy to get it back. Just tap the compass icon in the upper-right corner.

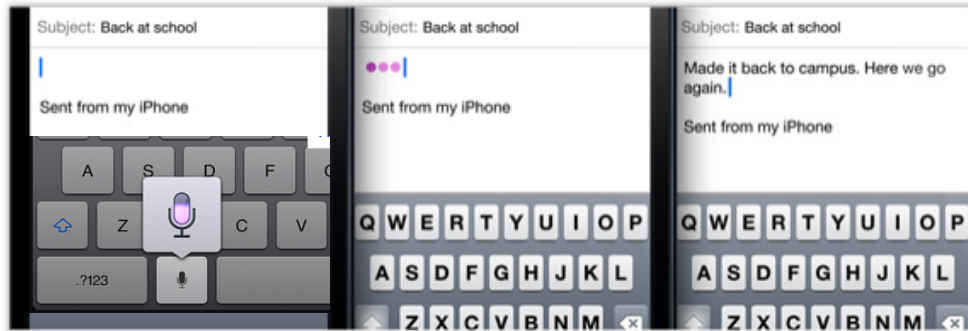


See how to use Siri.
When you press and hold the Home button, Siri asks, "What can I help you with?" Tap the "i" button to see a detailed list of the ways Siri can help you get things done.

Tell Siri who's who.
Tell Siri about your relationships, such as "Erin is my wife" or "Rick is my dad." Then you can say "Text my wife" or "Call dad" and Siri knows who you mean.

Set your locations.
Be sure to enter your home and work addresses in Contacts. That way, Siri can remind you to do things when you leave or arrive at either place.

Siri writes email.
You can dictate a quick response to an email. Just say "Reply," then tell Siri your message.

Instead of typing an email, tap the microphone icon on the keyboard and start talking. Tap Done, and your words will appear as text. Use dictation to write messages, take notes, update your Facebook status, tweet, and more.



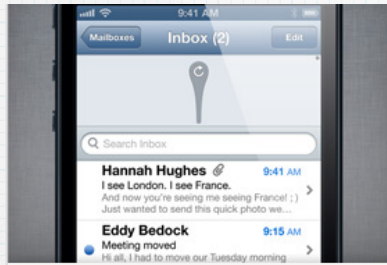
Quick, take a photo.

The camera icon is always there on your lock screen. Just swipe up to open the Camera app.



Switch directions in Panorama.

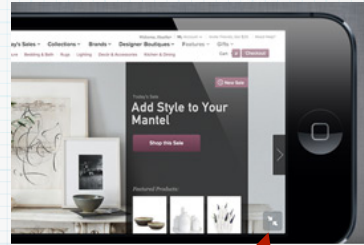
In panorama mode, you can easily shoot from left to right or right to left. Just tap the arrow to switch the direction.

Refresh your mailboxes in an instant with a quick downward swipe.



Take websites full screen.

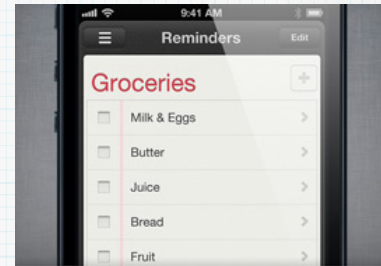


When you really want to see the whole picture, turn your iPhone to landscape and tap the full-screen icon to view web pages without distractions.



See what's up.

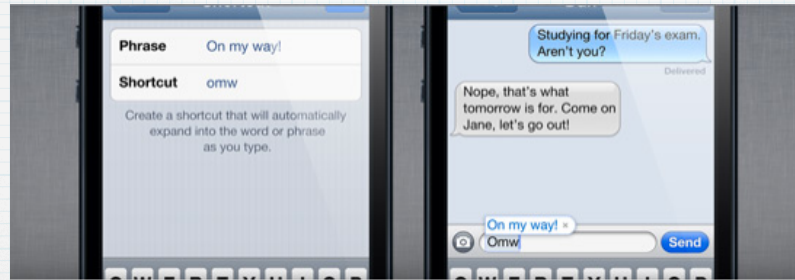
Notification Center lets you know about missed messages, calendar invitations, friend requests, and more. New notifications appear on top of the screen. Swipe down to see a summary of recent notifications.



Set reminders.

Assign due dates to items on your to-do list and Reminders will send you alerts. Add locations, and you'll get alerts when you leave or when you arrive. You can also choose priority levels and write notes.





Customize your keyboard.

Create your own personal dictionary, including shortcuts for each word. So your keyboard not only autocorrects, it knows exactly what you want to say as you type. In Settings, tap General > Keyboard > Add New Shortcut. From there you can add new phrases and assign optional shortcuts to them.



Everything has an alert.

Assign a specific tone or create a custom vibration for new mail, Calendar alerts, tweets, and reminders. In Settings, tap Sounds to assign each a tone or vibration.



Locate your lost iPhone.



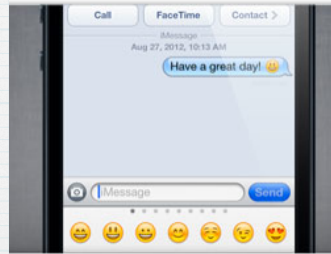
If you've lost your iPhone, Find My iPhone can help you locate it. Just go to Settings > iCloud and turn on the Find My iPhone feature.

Touch and hold to save image.

In Safari, touch and hold an image to save it to your Camera Roll or copy it to paste into an MMS or email.





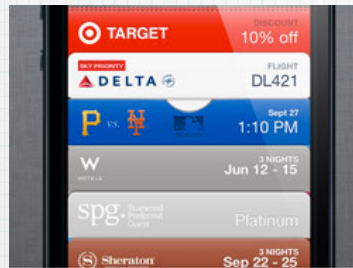
Give your texts some character.

Access all sorts of smileys, animals, shapes, and other peculiarities from your emoji-enabled keyboard. Just go to Settings > General > Keyboard and tap International Keyboards. Add a new keyboard and select Emoji. Now when you type, just tap the globe button and choose the emoji that fits the mood.



Get some peace and quiet.

In Settings, turn on Do Not Disturb to avoid dealing with all incoming calls and notifications. Enable it manually or schedule a recurring time. Or allow calls from your favorites or specific contact groups.



Stay organized with Passbook-enabled apps.



Download Passbook-enabled apps from the App Store, and any passes or tickets you buy from those apps show up in Passbook.



Create web clips.



To add a website to your Home screen, visit the page in Safari and tap the Share button at the bottom of the Safari window. Then tap Add to Home Screen.



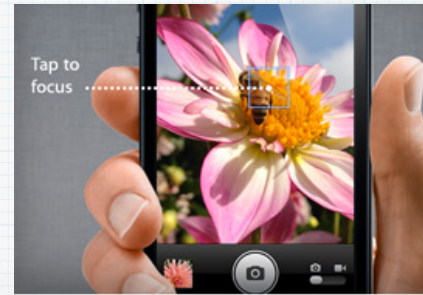
Learn some keyboard tricks.

- Tap the space bar twice, and iPhone adds a period and capitalizes the next word.
- To enter a number or symbol quickly, touch and hold **123**, then select the key you want. Lifting your finger returns you to the alphabet keyboard.
- Touch and hold a letter to reveal a list of special characters.



Take a picture of your screen.

Press and hold the Sleep/Wake button, then press the Home button. Your screen flashes and the picture appears in your Camera Roll.

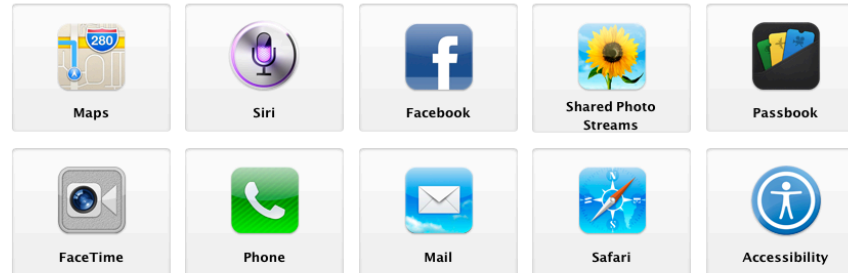


Tap to focus the camera.

While shooting video or photos, tap the screen where you want to focus. iPhone also adjusts the exposure and white balance automatically.
