Apple is very concerned about **security** (protecting your Mac) and **privacy** (protecting your information).

You don't need a password manager as Safari does it for you. In **Safari Preferences>Passwords** turn on **AUTOFILL.** You can also AutoFill credit cards and/or forms. With Credit cards you will still have to fill in the security code. Your really don't need Other Forms; all you need to do is start to fill it in and the form will pick up your info from your Contact card.

To Lookup saved passwords: Go to Safari Preferences> Passwords. You are confronted with a locked pop-up, type in your log in computer password and press Return/Enter to see those you have saved.

Click on the Password dotted line to reveal the password. Note: though the Passwords look like all the same short length, they are not, they are much longer.

It is not a good idea to create our own passwords as we often use the same one over and over. A warning triangle appears if you have used the same password on more than one site. If someone gets your password for one website, they may be able to access your accounts on other websites.
